Please read, print and bring this guide with you to the Games, which contains helpful information about the activities taking place during the week ahead. Note: This information is subject to change, but is current as of July 27, 2010 and supersedes information printed in the souvenir program book.

For updates, changes, or answers to any additional questions, ask your Team Manager, Donor Family Liaison, Local Team Host or come to **the Games Information Desk** (see location below). In addition, National Kidney Foundation representatives, wearing orange “Staff” polo shirts, will be around to assist you.

Let the Games begin!

## GAMES INFORMATION DESK

On Friday, July 30<sup>th</sup>, and Saturday, July 31<sup>st</sup> the **Games Information Desk** will be at the main entrance of Monona Terrace near the Hall of Ideas. Beginning on Sunday, August 1<sup>st</sup>, the Desk will be located outside Hall B of the Alliant Energy Center Exhibition Hall. The hours of operations each day are as follows:

The Games Information Desk will be staffed to provide you with Games information, as well as information on local restaurants and attractions.

## EVENT ACCESS

Your Games registration includes an event **credential** that identifies you as an event participant, which will grant you **admission** to all official competition venues, hotels and special events, as well as access to the **Games Expo**. Also included in your registration is a **goody bag**, a **Souvenir Program**, and other event materials. Beginning on Saturday, July 31<sup>st</sup>, participants will be required to show their Games credential for entry into most venues. A \$15.00 day pass will be required for those who do not wish to register for the entire event. Day passes can be purchased in the Games Store July 30<sup>th</sup>–August 3<sup>rd</sup>.

\*Additional fees are required for the 5K Race for Organ, Eye and Tissue Donation Awareness (excluding Games athletes) and Youth Program activities.

For access to the Games Transportation Shuttle, **please be prepared to present your credential bearing the Games “Shuttle Pass” icon to the driver, beginning on Sunday, August 1st**. Shuttle passes may be purchased for \$15.00/day or \$40.00/week on-site during registration hours at Monona Terrace or at the Games Store.

**No One Will Be Permitted To Utilize The Games Shuttle Without A Games Shuttle Pass Or Credential.**

## CREDENTIAL POLICY

An Event Credential or Day Pass is required for admission to most 2010 NKF U.S. Transplant Games competitions. In the event that an athlete/spectator loses or forgets his or her credential, the individual will be required to purchase a **one-time** replacement credential at a cost of \$25.00. This one-time replacement credential can be purchased at the Games Store. In the event that a credential is lost a second time, the individual will be required to purchase Day Passes at a cost of \$15.00 per day as well as a Shuttle Day Pass (if applicable) at an additional cost of \$15.00 per day or \$40.00 for the week. (For example, if an individual loses a \$25.00 replacement credential, it will cost \$30.00 per day for admission and transportation should he/she need shuttle service. If shuttle service is not desired, the cost will be \$15.00 per day for admission only.)

## INDIVIDUAL ATHLETE PHOTOGRAPHS

Genentech, a sponsor of the Games, has made special arrangements for each 2010 NKF U.S. Transplant Games athlete to have an individual photo taken in! This picture will be sent to his or her transplant surgeon as a special "thank you" to his/her surgeon and to demonstrate the success of the living donation and/or transplant surgery.

To have pictures taken, athletes can simply stop by the Genentech photo station during Registration and Expo hours: **3:00 PM to 7:00 PM on Friday, July 30<sup>th</sup> and 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM on Saturday, July 31<sup>st</sup>.** Please wear your team uniform!

## TEAM PHOTOGRAPHS

In order to best serve all attendees and reduce waiting time, teams will be checked-in by appointment. To find out your team's scheduled appointment time, please refer to the Team Appointment Schedule on pages 11 and 12 of this Daily Event Guide. Please plan to arrive on time for your team's appointment. Early and late arrivals for registration appointments will only lengthen the registration process.

IPI Wisconsin Photography will be taking the team portraits during registration check-in, as well as candid photos throughout the event, which will be available for purchase onsite. Attached is a pre-order form, which you can bring to your check-in/photo appointment to order your Team photo early. Payments can be made by cash or credit card.

## GENERAL COMPETITION INFORMATION

Age Groups: (unless specified elsewhere): 5 and Under, 6-10, 11-13, and 14-17, 18-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-69, and 70 and over.

Athletes may not enter events that take place at the same time in different venues. Failure of an athlete to appear at any event when called will result in the athlete being eliminated from the competition. **There will be no appeal of any disqualification for failure to appear.**

Medals: Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded for the top three competitors in all sporting event age categories. International athletes are welcome to compete, but will only earn duplicate medals in an international division. If an athlete is not present for a medal presentation, the Team Manager can pick up medals at the competition. Post competition, the Manager or athlete can receive medals at the Games Information Desk. Beginning on Sunday, August 1<sup>st</sup>, the Desk will be located outside Hall at the Alliant Energy Center Exhibition Hall.

Please note: The athlete is responsible for arriving early enough to check-in at their event and be ready to compete.

**Athletes Not Present At the Start Of Their Competitions Will Be Scratched.**

## **COMPETITION BRACKETS & RESULTS**

Sports brackets, heat sheets, competition results and message boards will be posted in the lobby of the Exhibition Hall at the Alliant Energy Center beginning on Sunday, August 1<sup>st</sup> (look for results on the day after the competition).

## **ATHLETE HYDRATION**

The weather in mid July can vary from pleasant summer temperatures to hot and humid conditions with the potential for heat-related illnesses. Hydration before, during, and after each practice or event will be a key factor in the prevention of heat-related illness. Competitors are expected to know their individual fluid needs and it is recommended that participants replace their sweat losses throughout the Games. All venues will have drinking water available. Should a registered spectator become dehydrated and oral hydration is ineffective, that individual(s) will be transported to the appropriate medical facility via ambulance for further evaluation.

## **ATHLETE MEDICAL INFORMATION**

Medical staff and volunteers will be present at all athletic events of the Games. These individuals will be clearly identified by distinctive safety green shirts with the word "MEDICAL" in large letters on the back. Athletes, upon arrival at a venue, should note the location of the medical services staff.

The Main medical station is located in the Alliant Energy Center (AEC) in the rear of Hall A.

For all medical emergencies taking place after hours or away from the competition sites, participants should dial 911.

In order to ensure an effective and timely Registration, Check-In and Photo experience, please familiarize yourself with the step-by-step process below:

1. Arrive 15 minutes prior to your appointment time and check in with your Team Manager.
2. Once your Team Manager verifies that your team is ready to take their photo, primary team members (athletes, living donors and donor families) will be called into the photo area as all team supporters proceed to check-in.
3. Primary team members will join the rest of their team at check-in after the photo has been taken. At check in, you will receive the following:
  - An Event Credential identifying you as a Games registrant.
  - Admission to all competition venues, Games hotels and special events.
  - Access to the Games Expo.
  - Official Games registration bag.
  - The official Games Souvenir Program (if you registered as an athlete or non-athlete).
  - A ticket to the Team Tailgate Party.
  - 5K T-Shirt Voucher (if you are an athlete and have purchased a 5K Race t-shirt upgrade on your online registration. Pre-registered non-athletes will have a tear-off at the bottom of their Bib # that will allow them to pick up their t-shirt in the Games expo or on race day at the finish line area. T-shirts will be provided to those who register on Race Day only while supplies last).
  - Bib # (for all Games athletes, and non-athletes who pre-registered for the 5K Race).
  - Recipient, Living Donor and Donor Family T-Shirt Coupon (for Primary Team Members).
  - Games Shuttle Sticker (if you have purchased a Games Shuttle Transportation Pass as an upgrade or booked your housing through the Games Online Registration site).

**Format:**

Competition in this event will be showcase style for partner dances.

Three Divisions:

- Latin/Rhythm: Rumba, Cha Cha, Jive, Paso Doble and Samba
- Standard/Smooth: Waltz, Foxtrot, Quickstep, Viennese Waltz and Tango
- Nightclub: Argentine Tango, Lindy Hop, West Coast Swing, Hustle and Salsa

Competing pairs may perform any dance within a Division; due to the limited number of possible entries, pairs may only enter one division. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded for each Division. In the event of a tie for a medal position, the team with the greater number of highest votes of the judges will be ranked first. If still a tie, it will go to the next highest vote, etc. Non-medal positions will be recorded as ties. At least one dancer in the pair must be a recipient and both must be registered for the Games. Judging will be based solely on the performance of the recipient. Partners may be mixed or same gender, ages 11 and over. Each competitor's performance must be choreographed and should be between 1 ½ to 2 minutes, maximum of 2 ½ minutes.

**Rules:** As a general guide, USA Table Tennis Association rules can be found at [www.usatt.org/rules](http://www.usatt.org/rules). As a reminder, United States Table Tennis Association (USTTA) rules state that competitors must wear dark colored shirts so as not to obscure the ball.

**Format:** Competition in men's and women's singles. First round(s) will be round robins, two out of three games to 11 points; top individuals advance to a single elimination tournament, best three out of five games to 11 points. Age group starting times will be provided to Team Managers at the first Team Managers’ meeting—see your Team Manager for your age-group starting time.

**Equipment:** Players must provide their own racket; rackets must have different-colored sides. No sandpaper rackets are permitted.

Check-in is 30 minutes prior to start time.

**Rules:**

These rules are based on the National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations Rules with the following adaptations:

1. Teams will consist of a maximum of six players. Three players are required to start the game. A team may continue with two players, if no other eligible players are available.
2. Each team should have two sets of uniform shirts available, one white and one dark. Each shirt should have a legal number printed on the front and back, no smaller than eight inches high. (Legal numbers are: 0-5, 10-15, 20-25, 30-35, 40-45 and 50-55.)
3. The team at the top of the bracket will be designated the home team.
4. Games will be played half court.
5. All games will be officiated by one or two officials.
6. First possession will be determined by a coin flip before the game between two team representatives. The visitor shall make the call and have the choice.
7. Games will consist of two 15-minute halves. The clock will be on running time except for in the final two minutes of the second half. In the final two minutes of the second half, the clock will stop when play is disrupted by the official's whistle. Half-time will be five minutes in duration
8. The ball must be taken behind the 3-point line after each change of possession. (The ball must be in possession of a player whose feet are behind the 3-point arc.)
9. After each made basket, the ball must be checked at the top of the key and thrown to another player to start play. The team that was on defense will be awarded the ball. (Not make it; take it.)
10. Three points are scored for a successful shot from beyond the 3-point arc, two points for all other goals from the floor. One point is scored for a successful free throw.
11. After five team fouls, any foul in the act of shooting will be awarded two free throws. The ball will be alive if the second free throw is missed. If both free throws are made, the ball is awarded as if a team scored during regular play.
12. A player, after committing five fouls, will be disqualified from the game.
13. Each team may call two timeouts per game. Timeouts are one-minute in duration and the clock will be stopped. The timer will sound the warning horn at the 45-second mark and play will resume at the one-minute mark.
14. If the game is tied at the end of regulation play, a two-minute overtime period will be played after a one-minute intermission. A coin flip will determine first possession. This procedure will be repeated until a winner is determined. Due to the limited number of possible entries, each team in the Games will be allowed one basketball team entry. Additional basketball entries will be based on overall team size.

**Format:** Basketball includes five divisions: Open, Recreation, Co-Ed Open, Co-Ed Rec, and Youth.

Co-Ed teams require one woman on the court at all times. Youth teams are for athletes 6–13 years old.

All other teams play in an opening round with the usual seeding procedures (medalists from previous Games will be seeded). Winning teams from the first round will advance to the "Open" division and play for Open medals. Losing teams will advance to the "Recreation" division and play for Recreation medals. Teams will be guaranteed at least two games.

All players must wear court shoes.
